

In the student admission process, UNY openly provides equal opportunities for prospective students from various economic backgrounds. UNY specifically facilitates learning opportunities that are supported scholarship schemes. There are 6153 UNY students who study with scholarship support. In addition, UNY also applies tuition payments based on 7 levels of Single Tuition Fee (UKT) rates.

Low-income student support

UNY provides financial support through scholarship programs, <u>adjustment of tuition</u> <u>fee scheme</u>, assistance with internet data packages during the COVID-19 pandemic, assistance with treatment costs for students and lecturers who are positive for COVID-19, Student Employment and other assistance.

Low or lower-middle income countries student support

There are 2 UNY schemes for international students who come from low-income countries. First, the KNB Scholarship (Developing Country Partnership) and the YSU-DISS Scholarship. Second, the Students Employment program.

Local start-up assistance

UNY encourages students to have an entrepreneurial spirit through lectures and support in establishing various start-ups according to the interests and areas of expertise of UNY students. UNY conducts coaching through the UNY Business Incubator. To measure the development of Start-ups, start-up founder students are encouraged to take part in competitions for start-ups.

Local start-up financial assistance

UNY provides financial support for local startups through several schemes. First, the UNY Study Program Start Up Grant scheme. In this scheme, submissions are made by UNY students who carry out activities in the local community. Second, the startup incubation program. Through this program, in 2021 there will be 18 start-ups participating in the selection. Start-ups that pass the selection will receive a startup development assistance fund of Rp. 40 million.

Programmes for services access

Education is one of the catalysts for social mobility for people with low incomes. UNY, through various community services schemes, has carried out various trainings and mentoring, the goal of which is to open up opportunities for job creation and open up opportunities to increase income. In 2021, UNY has conducted ecoprint training, food processing innovation training, dish soap

making training and water hyacinth craft training. UNY has also carried out assistance in the tourism village scheme, and the development of MSMEs. To support the implementation of the program in a measurable manner, UNY already has a Community Service Program Guideline.

Policy making addressing poverty

UNY has several policies to address the problem of poverty. For UNY students, the policies that have been made are related to scholarship facilitation, categorization of fees based on financial ability, tuition to adjust tuition opportunities fees. opportunities to become student employment, and other financial assistance. UNY through various community service seeks to open up business programs, opportunities for the community through business trainings for the general public, development of fostered villages, and assistance to MSMEs.



Mental health support


<u>UPT LBK UNY</u> through <u>e-counseling</u> provides opportunities for students, lecturers and staff to get free mental health services.



Procedure for counseling services at UPT LBK UNY:

- 1. Online and offline registration
- 2.Initial assessment
- 3.Counseling
- 4. Evaluation of counseling by students.
- 5. Counseling report by counselor.

Based on the number of people undergoing counseling sessions in 2020-2022, there is a downward trend in the number. This proves that UNY mental health services are working well with positive results.

Research on Mental Health

Based on the results of a survey conducted by the Counseling Center Service Unit of UNY that the highest problems experienced by students were personal problems at 58.02% while learning difficulties were 19.81%, social problems at 15, 82% and career problems at 1, 96%.

The results of the international collaboration research that has been carried out by the counseling center regarding the occupational stress of lecturers at UNY and the factors causing it. With a population of 1023 people, the research sample is 212 people. The results show the stress level of FE lecturers = 44.4% FMIPA lecturers = 33.3%, FIP lecturers = 27.1%, FBS lecturers = 21.1%, FT lecturers = 18.2%, FIS lecturers = 13.3%, FIK Lecturer = 4.8%.

There are 3 factors that cause stress in UNY lecturers:

Physical Health 28.4% Psychological tensions 39.1% Mental well-being 32.5%

GENDER

Regarding UNY's new student admissions, UNY already has a policy as stated in the UNY Rector's Regulation No. 15 of 2019 regarding admission services. This regulation has been prepared in accordance with the Regulation of the Minister of Research, Technology and **Higher Education of the Republic of Indonesia** No. 2 of 2015. In accordance with the Ministerial Regulation, UNY's new student admissions are held on a fair principle (no distinction between religion, ethnicity, race, gender, age)., social position, and economic ability of prospective students), accountable (according to clear procedures and criteria), and transparent (implementation admission is carried out openly and the results of the implementation can be accessed by all parties easily).

To encourage more interest from prospective UNY female students for study programs with rare number of female students, UNY promotes scholarship programs in UNY's Mechanical, Electrical, and Civil Engineering study programs.

Policy of non-discrimination against women

As a part of UNY commitment to the implementation of good corporate governance, and in order to prevent and carry out early detection of possible violations, UNY has developed a Whistleblowing System (WBS) which can be accessed online. This system is in line with efforts to prevent violence against women as stated in the Rector's Regulation no. 6 of 2022.

ENERGY-EFFICIENT RENOVATION AND BUILDING

UNY has carried out 3 (three) efforts to respond to the challenges of climate change and energy. First, the application of building design that supports natural lighting and good air circulation. The design of this building is the use of glass material for buildings and corridor designs that are equipped with adequate natural ventilation. Second, the application of a system that saves energy use through the installation of several light sensors, fire sensors, and the use of projectors that use low power in various buildings at UNY. Third, the gradual renewal of old equipment and equipment for both learning activities and institutional management. The semi-automatic door system that was implemented in several buildings a few years ago has not been replaced by fully automatic doors. This is due to the high cost of reimbursement if it is carried out simultaneously in all UNY buildings.

In constructing a new building, UNY complies with the Regulation of the Minister of Public Works and Public Housing of the Republic of Indonesia concerning Green Buildings

CARBON REDUCTION AND EMISSION REDUCTION PROCESS



In the field of renewable energy research, UNY's student team named "EV-22" won all championship categories at the 2022 Formula Electric Student Championship (FESC) Indonesia International Motor Show (IIMS). First place in the Skidpad category and first place in the endurance category. The "EV-22" student group championship in transportation research with sustainable energy further strengthens UNY's commitment to always prioritize sustainable energy in all aspects.

UNY conducts periodic emission tests and prohibits the use of vehicles that do not pass the emission test in accordance with the Rector's Regulation Number 20 of 2017 Article 10

Plan to reduce energy consumption



UNY won the Energy Saving Car Contest after going through 8 laps and 11.6 KM track. In the contest, the vehicle with the least fuel consumption wins.



In March 2021, UNY students succeeded in developing a portable hydro-coil turbine power plant that can operate with the flow of ditches and irrigation networks built in rural areas. This generator is easy to use, economical, and easy to move, making it easier for users to optimize the energy produced.

Indicator: Energy usage per sqm

The total electricity consumption of Yogyakarta State University (UNY) in 2021 is calculated based on the average electricity usage from January to December 2021, which is 5,790,251 KWh (20,844.9 gigajoules). With an area of 533936 m2, the electricity usage at UNY is 0.03 GJ/m2. Appointment of an energy management team in charge of preparing plans, implementing, inspecting, taking actions based on Rector's Regulation no. 20 of 2017 is the right time to optimally control the energy management program.

COMMITMENT TO DECENT WORK AND ECONOMIC GROWTH

Yogyakarta State University provides decent working conditions and salaries for its staff. Healthy, decent, and fair HR management, based on Rector Regulation No. 16 of 2018 to support a conducive work atmosphere by paying attention to rights and obligations, which regulates all matters related to HR management, from appointment, performance appraisal, career development, salary, discipline until termination. UNY has a strong commitment to carry out good and conducive academic life practices with the issuance of Rector's Regulation no. 4 of 2015 concerning the Code of Ethics for Education Personnel and Rector's Regulation No. 5 of 2015 concerning the Code of Ethics for Lecturers.



The regulation states that UNY citizens must maintain a code of ethics to live respectfully and not to discriminate. This provision is also followed by sanctions for violations ranging from warnings to suspension of promotions and ranks. UNY also conducts a gender equality study to avoid discriminatory practices at UNY and is also included in the research plan developed by UNY. In addition, to regulate academic freedom, freedom of academic pulpit and scientific autonomy, UNY issued Rector Regulation No. 8 of 2013.

UNY has established a Certification and Career Center as a forum for developing the quality of human resources into competent and ready-to-use workforce. UNY has collaborated with more than 200 companies for career development programs, seminars, job fairs, tracer studies, etc



With regard to economic growth and decent work, in 2021, there will be 11 integrated studies and 1 ppm in Kapanewon Bugel, Kulon Progo. UNY also has a business incubator, one of which aims to optimize the utilization of educated human resources in driving the economy by utilizing science and technology. UNY students are also facilitated by entrepreneurship development programs through the Entrepreneurial Student Program (PMW), Digital Entrepreneurship Program (PWD) and real work college programs (KKN) that contribute to the community for community empowerment, one of which is in the field of economic growth by mentoring and making MSME profile videos.



Commitment to Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure

innovation

Based on the Chancellor's Decree Number B/1053/ UN34/KP.08.01/2019 UNY established an Innovation Center, Business Incubator, and intellectual property. The main tasks of the innovation center, business incubator, and IPR are to increase science and technology innovation. provide quidance. entrepreneurship development, assist business incubators and MSMEs, as well as act as a center for intellectual property rights. In 2021, UNY targets 15 startups, but the achievements are 3 startups, namely liquid smoke and biochar compost Bukata, Putra Jaya Farm, and Nevair Tonic. At the same time, 4 startup candidates were developed. The number of innovations in the form of products, models and processes is 23 of the target of 10 innovations.



Liquid smoke is produced by utilizing raw materials derived from livestock and agricultural waste, namely chicken farm waste and rice husks which are processed through pyrolysis. The benefits of the product are to deal with all types of pests and diseases of agricultural and plantation crops, reduce pollution from cage odors, can be applied as foliar fertilizers and plant growth regulators, wood preservatives and processed food products.





Putra Jaya Farm innovated the omega 3 zero waste domestic chicken farming system through hybrid technology for maggot and fish cultivation. Nevair Tonic products use herbal active ingredients in the form of banana hump water with a concentration of 10%. This product is present as an herbal hair tonic product that is able to overcome the problem of dandruff and hair loss at the same time. Nevair Tonic is designed in bottles of 100 ml and 250 ml with a pointed cap and spray so that it is efficient and easy to apply.





At UNY, we pride ourselves on our ability to think differently and pioneer innovations across multiple sectors:

We provide innovation, management, and entrepreneurship programs in the undergraduate program, masters and entrepreneurship programs in the master's program, and management in the doctoral program. We also integrate industry experience into a wide range of science, engineering, and social science programs.

We have labs and other facilities that can be used with the community for education, research, community service.



Entrepreneurship is one of the additional competencies that are expected to be mastered by UNY students. Entrepreneurship development activities are carried out in a structured, systematic, and consistent manner to encourage students to become entrepreneurs. Entrepreneurship in 2021 is targeted at 190 and as many as 340 students are entrepreneurship.

UNY is proud to have more than 50% of students so that they can contribute to gender equality in education and also to improve the quality of human resources in general.



OUR PROGRAMS AND POLICY ON RESPONSIBLE CONSUMPTION AND PRODUCTION

Waste disposal - hazardous materials Hazardous waste generated at UNY is waste that comes from student practicums both in the laboratory and workshop workshops. Management of hazardous waste originating from the laboratory such as acid, wet, and organic waste is collected into a collector's drum and then labeled, in addition to that, toxic waste from this laboratory is channeled into a holding tank. If the drum and the reservoir are full, they will be distributed to a third party, namely PT. Arah Indonesia Environmental. UNY has collaborated with PT. Arah Indonesia Environmental since July 2021.

To reduce the use of plastic from bottled drinking water, UNY has distributed tumblers and placed water dispensers in various rooms. In addition, to reduce the use of plastic bags, UNY uses reusable cloth bags.


